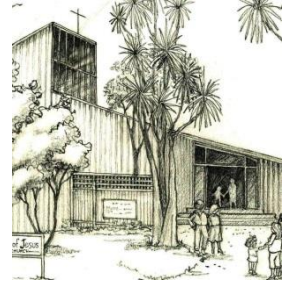

Bishop of Hamilton Steve Lowe, Secretary of the NZ Catholic Bishops Conference, says our bishops have received many questions about the formation of the new lay catechists, and how the ministry will link to lay pastoral workers.
