A short reflection on the Gospel

The second part of the Gospel explains Jesus' parable about the sower sowing seeds on different types of soil or ground. Sometimes our soil (souls) may not be ready to receive the word, so it cannot produce a rich harvest. "Listen, anyone who has ears to hear." We need ears to hear the word of God. Sometimes the word of God makes us feel uncomfortable which is a good feeling. It means the word of God is doing its job. St John Chrysostom was known for being a wonderful preacher and received the nickname 'chrysostomos' meaning 'golden mouth'. His preaching also upset some who were offended by his message. They didn't really want to hear the word of God. The word of God is here to challenge us and make us better people.
