Sunday's Scriptures

Genesis 2:18-24 Psalm 127 Hebrews 2:9-11 Mark 10:2-16

A short reflection on the first reading

"It is not good that man should be alone." God cared about the man and was concerned that he was alone, and he didn't want this. We have two creation accounts in the Book of Genesis and today's first reading comes from the second creation account. It would be helpful to read the second creation account in full. One thing I noticed is that God put Adam in Eden 'to till it and keep it.' (v 15). I would have thought that Eden would have been a perfect garden, not needing care. But even Eden was dependant on Adam to care for it, e.g. till it. Adam is the same as Eden, needing care (helpmate) and no wild beast or bird was found to be a suitable helpmate for him, so woman was created as man slept. We were created not to be alone and to work e.g. 'to till it and keep it,' and this was before Adam and Eve sinned.
