Wednesday's Scriptures St Martin of Tours - Bishop (317-397) Memorial

Isaiah 61:1-3 Psalm 88:2-5,21-22,25,27 Matthew 25:31-40

A short reflection

When St Martin of Tours was a solider, he met a poor beggar on the road trembling with cold, begging from those passing by. He had nothing to offer him, so he took his sword and cut his cloak in half and gave half to the beggar. Bystanders laughed at St Martin wearing half a cloak and others felt ashamed that they hadn't helped the beggar themselves. That night as St Martin slept, he saw Christ dressed in half a garment and heard these words: "Martin, still a catechumen, has covered me with this garment."

Our first reading today is a good Scripture to use for your prayer. In the verses, the Lord is speaking to us directly. "The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for the Lord has anointed me...."

Let us pray for those in our community who have Covid. We pray for their speedy recovery. We pray for those who are caring and looking after those who have Covid, that the Lord will keep them safe and assist them in their medical work.
